GARNETT, JAMES HENRY—Clergyman, Educator b. Carter Plan-Gordon County, Georgia 1847; s. James K. and Levina (Carter) Garnett; m. Ida Lee Drake, August 15, 1888; two children, Ida D. and James Malcom; educ. Oberlin (A.B. 1887) Mormon Park, Illinois Theological Course (B.D. 1886); Selma University (D.D. 1891); Arkansas Baptist College (LL.D. 1926); President, Arkansas Baptist College, Little Rock, Arkansas 1886-87; President and Co-founder, Guadalupe, Sequin, Texas, 1887-91; President, State University (Simmons University) Louisville, Kentucky 1891-95; President, Houston College, Houston, Texas 1894-99; Chairman of Languages (Greek and Latin), Lincoln University, Jefferson City, Missouri for nine years; In business in Gary, Indiana (real estate and insurance) until 1922; Dean of Theology and Chaplain of Kansas Industrial and Educational Institute, Topeka, Kansas, 1922-25; Teacher of Systematic Theology and New Testament Greek, American Baptist Theological Seminary 1924-38; Dean of Seminary, October 28, 1927-39; Acting President, April 8, 1930-April 12, 1932. Although Dr. Garnett was never honored with the elective office of President, it is to his credit and honor that the American Baptist Theological Seminary stands as a beaconlight today, for it was through his efforts that many of the problems of administration were solved. His memory is retained through the annual Garnett-Nabrit lecture series each year.¹



NABRIT, JAMES MADISON—Clergyman, Educator b. September 17, 1877, Atlanta, Georgia. s. J. Clarke and Margaret (Knox Petty) Nabrit; m. Augusta G. West, May 5, 1899; eight children, James M. Jr., Samuel M., Ann, Gertrude, Henry, Lois, Margaret, Cecelia; educ. Morehouse College, Atlanta, Georgia (A.B., D.D.); Virginia Union Seminary, Richmond, Virginia (M.A.); Morris College (D.D.), Chicago, Illinois; Pastor, St. James Church, Forsyth, Georgia 1902-07; Bethesda Church, Americus, Georgia, 1907-12; Springfield Baptist Church, Augusta, Georgia, 1912-21; Mt. Olive Baptist Church, Atlanta, Georgia 1921-36; Teacher, Central College 1899-1907; Americus Institute 1907-12; Walker Institute 1915-20; Trustee Morehouse and Atlanta Universities, Atlanta, Georgia; General Secretary of the National Baptist Convention, Inc. 1931-1946; President of Georgia Baptist Convention; Elected president of American Baptist Theological Seminary April 23, 1936. Six months after accepting this position he suffered a severe back injury which left him a half invalid, nevertheless the school experienced its greatest encouragement and the groundwork for this institution was laid during his administration. Dr. Nabrit resigned in order to resume the pastorate in Atlanta, Georgia. He died there in 1947.²

HISTORY OF THE GARNETT-NABRIT LECTURES

"... they . . . expounded unto him the way of God more perfectly."
—Acts 18:26b

Even in the midst of learning situations, there come moments when that which is learned need be enhanced, enriched and enlightened. This concept seemingly was in the mind of Dr. J. C. Miles as he, under the leadership of Dr. J. M. Nabrit, the President of the American Baptist Theological Seminary, directed the first Missionary Conference in March, 1937.

There was also an Annual Conference on Pastoral Problems held in November, 1937, and was closed with a celebration of Founder's Day. The conferences were combined at least by 1943 and continued each year until 1957.

In 1949 the conception of the Garnett-Nabrit lectures was realized.

At the Annual Meeting of the Alumni Association held June 3, 1949, a committee (J. T. Moore, B. E. Callier, J. T. Ridley, W. N. Daniel, Charles Williams and William H. Donaldson) reported that they had polled the alumni throughout the country and received the majority of votes in favor of a Garnett-Nabrit Lectureship. This Lectureship was created and named for Drs. J. H. Garnett and J. M. Nabrit. Dr. Garnett had served as Dean of the Institution and was acting President at several interims. In 1936 he was elected President-Emeritus and was retired in 1940. The other personality was Dr. Nabrit, the Secretary of the National Baptist Convention, U.S.A., Inc., who served as President of the Seminary from 1936 to 1944.¹

It was not until 1957 that the birth of the Garnett-Nabrit Lectures was actualized. For in the April 30-May 1, 1957 meeting of the Board of Trustees the vote was made to change the name of the Annual Ministers and Missionary Conference to the Garnett-Nabrit lectures in honor of the Former Dean, Dr. J. H. Garnett and Dr. J. M. Nabrit, the fourth President of the Seminary. The first Lecture Series was held April 30-May 1, 1958, under the co-directorship of Professor Joseph M. Conley, Director of Seminary Extension, and Dr. Maynard P. Turner, President. In 1964, the Alumni Association strengthened the Lecture Series by initiating an Alumni Banquet. Each year an Alumnus is chosen by the Alumni Association to deliver the Banquet Address. These Lecture Series have been blessed with the priceless contributions of the speakers listed on the next page.

Focus

Biographical Sketches



Dr. Dale Moody is the Joseph Emerson Brown Professor of Christian Theology at the Southern Baptist Theological Seminary, Louisville, Kentucky. He has served on the faculty there for over thirty years.

Dr. Moody's academic credentials are impressive. He received the Th.M. and the Th.D. from Southern Baptist. After graduating from Southern, he studied in Switzerland where he came into close association with such noted theologians as Emil Brunner and Karl Barth. He later received the Ph.D. degree from Oxford University. Dr. Moody has many publications to his credit. His latest work is the book, *The Word of Truth: A Summary of Christian Doctrine Based on Biblical Revelation* (Eerdmans, 1981). He has also written books entitled *The Letters of John* and *The Letter of Romans* and was a contributor to the *Interpreter's Dictionary of the Bible*.

In addition to Dr. Moody's association with the academic community, he has served churches in Texas, Indiana and Kentucky. To the Garnett-Nabrit Lectures, Dr. Moody brings his extensive exposure and insight to the Christian faith.



Dr. Fred C. Lofton is the pastor of the Metropolitan Baptist Church, Memphis, Tennessee. For many years, he has been active in the denominational work of the Progressive National Baptist Convention (PNBC) and the American Baptist Churches. He currently serves as Second Vice President in the PNBC.

Dr. Lofton has received degrees from Morehouse College (B.A.), the Morehouse School of Religion (B.D.) and Emory University (S.T.D.). He has published on many occasions with two of those publications being the books, *When We Pray* and *Teach Us to Pray*. Soon to be released will be another book written by Dr. Lofton, *Help Me, Somebody!* (Progressive National Baptist Publishing House). He is also editing a book of sermons in tribute to Dr. Benjamin E. Mays.

Dr. Lofton is well respected among the preaching ranks and brings a wealth of experience and knowledge that spans the globe to the Garnett-Nabrit Lectures.



Dr. Vincent Leroy McCutcheon, received his degrees from American Baptist College in 1968 (B.A.) and 1969 (B.Th.). He studied further at the Vanderbilt University Divinity School, receiving the M.Div. degree in 1972 and the D.Min. degree in 1974. He has also completed the course work toward the Ph.D. degree. Dr. McCutcheon served as president of the student body while attending the American Baptist College. After graduating he came back to the College and served for periods of time as an instructor and as Campus Minister.

Dr. McCutcheon currently serves as pastor of the Antioch Baptist Church, East Chicago, Indiana. He has had many denominational positions including those of Moderator of the New Era District Association and President of the Martin Luther King Convention, State of Indiana. In addition, he currently serves as Dean of the East Chicago Unit of the American Baptist Theological Seminary Extension Program. He has served in many other capacities in the religious and academic communities, as well as the community-at-large.
