For ten years has led in a program aimed at developing National Baptist leadership, through employment of College and Seminary Teachers, Scholarships to students, state directors of cooperative work between National Baptists and Southern Baptists, Christian educational centers, Institutes, now serves as Secretary of the Department of Work with National Baptists of the Southern Baptist Home Mission Board.
