Foreword



PURPOSE

American Baptist Theological Seminary

The incentive for the founding of the institution grew out of the recognition of a long-felt need on the part of the Baptist fathers of the National Baptist Convention, U.S.A., Incorporated, and the Southern Baptist Convention for the establishment of a Seminary for the training of Negro ministers.

For more than a quarter of a century, the Seminary has been engaged in the training of ministers, missionaries and other Christian workers who are serving as pastors, presidents of schools, teachers and missionaries throughout America, in Africa, the West Indies, South and Central America and the Bahama Islands.

The institution has as its sole objective the training of men and women in Christian service. In its objective, it seeks to not only increase the academic knowledge of the student, but to provide a social and spiritual atmosphere in which a student may develop to the fullest extent those characteristics and capabilities of which he will make use in later life.

More than ever, the need for such an institution as the American Baptist Theological Seminary becomes significant. While concerned with the intellectual development of its students, its ideals are committed to the conviction that integrity, as well as other academic achievements figure as vitally in the development of the total life of Christian workers as any other single factor.
