Cherished Memories Of The Late Mabel Bell Crooks Boddie

December 30, 1915-August 30, 1987



Mabel Bell Crooks Boddie


Mrs. Mabel Bell Crooks Boddie was a native of Montgomery. The devoted wife of Dr. Charles Emerson Boddie, President Emeritus of American Baptist College. She came to Nashville in 1947 to work at Tennessee State University.

Mrs. Boddie received her bachelor's degree from West Virginia State University, and her Master's degree from the University of Indiana. She had also studied as a Kellogg Foundation Grant recipient at the University of Chicago, at the University of British Columbia (Vancouver), Michigan State University and The Banff (Alberta) School of Fine Arts. She began her career at TSU as a part-time instructor and staff writer in the university's bureau of public relations. She was named dean of women in 1957 and then in 1965 held a joint appointment as dean of women and director of public relations for four years. In 1969 she was appointed Director of Public Relations for TSU. Mrs. Boddie resigned from TSU in February 1982.

Mrs. Boddie supported her husband, Dr. Charles Emerson Boddie's approach to training preachers and Christian workers, a three-fold method, the training of mind, body, and soul.

A large collection of books, from the personal Library, of Dr. Walter Herrelson are now dedicated to the memory of Mrs. Boddie, in the American Baptist College Library.

Mrs. Boddie was a faithful member of the Women's Auxiliary of the American Baptist College at A.B.T. Seminary.





Dr. Richard D. Lucas

The Lamp is dedicated to Dr. Richard Lucas. Dr. Lucas came to American Baptist College in the Fall of 1965, and he has been the molding pot for many preachers as well as for lay persons. Dr. Lucas is a unique individual. Once you have sat under him for a semester, you will leave his classroom with lasting memories.

Dr. Lucas is the Director of the Division of Church Vocations, Professor of History, Biblical-Theological Studies, and Pastoral Studies. He received his B.A. from Carson Newman College in 1949; his B.D. from Southern Baptist Theological Seminary in 1953; Th.D from Southern Baptist Theological Seminary in 1959; followed by his Ph.D in 1974. Dr. Lucas also served as the Assistant Academic Dean in 1981-1982.














A Word From The Vice President For Academic Affairs
