THE PRESIDENT

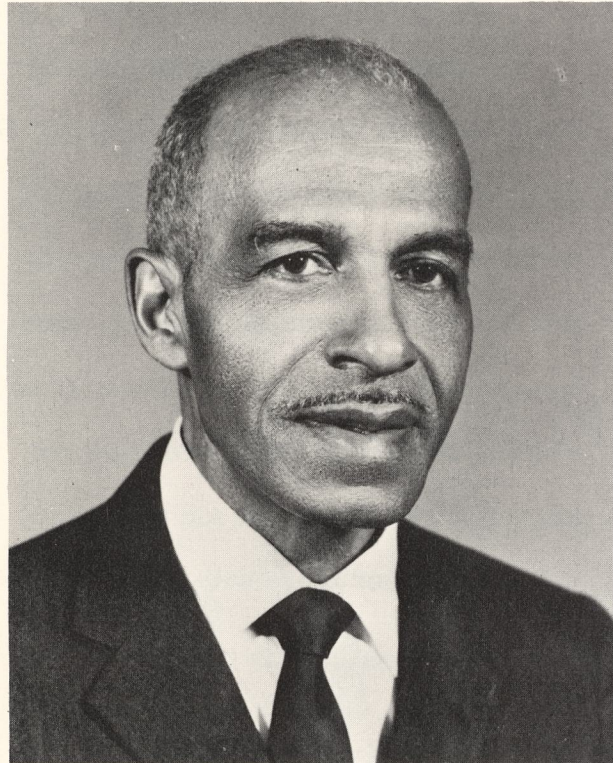

"That success lies, not in achieving what you aim at but in aiming at what you ought to achieve, and pressing forward sure of achieving here, or if not here, hereafter."

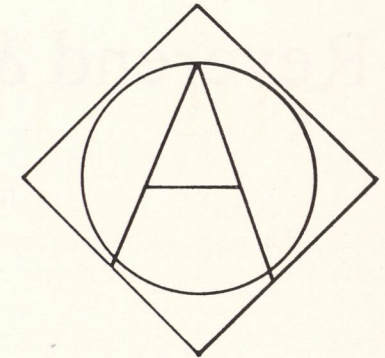
Because of this awareness the Student Senate is dedicated to the promotion of educational awareness and the christian perspectives to aid one another in brotherly love and understanding.

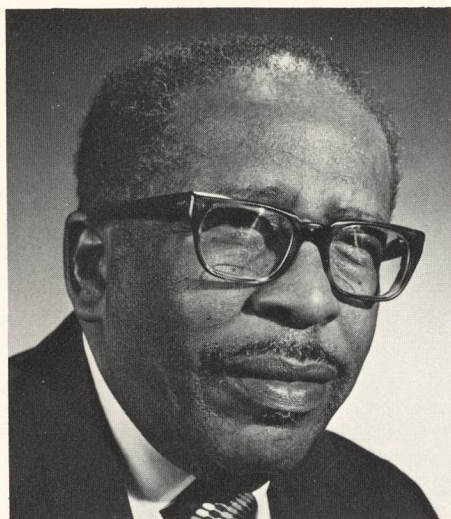
